#### **CATALOGUE DESCRIPTION:**

Focuses on the meaning of medical terms in specific context and their use in health related practice. Provides a base upon which to build a larger vocabulary.

**COURSE OBJECTIVES:** Upon successful completion of N214, the learner will:

- 1. Identify standard medical abbreviations.
- 2. Combine prefixes, suffixes and root words to form medical terms.
- 3. Discuss medical terminology specific to Medical Specialties and Body Systems.
- 4. Describe diseases, laboratory/diagnostic procedures, medical/surgical procedures, and drug categories in relation to Medical Specialties and Body Systems

#### **LEARNING STRATEGIES:**

Strategies include use of modules, case studies, activities, powerpoints, exercises, games, quizzes, and examinations. Designed to be offered through Internet delivery. Some traditional delivery may be used.

There are 15 Chapters/Lessons utilized in this course. You will have a quiz for each Chapter. You will have 1 minute per question to complete each quiz. They are administered via Pearson MyMedicalTerminologyLab under each Chapter (see Course Calendar posted in Moodle for dates/times). Do NOT wait until the last minute to take quizzes as technical problems can arise. NOTE THAT QUIZZES WILL NOT BE REOPENED AFTER THE QUIZ DUE DATE. There are no make-ups for missed quizzes.

There are 5 Non-cumulative Exams that cover 3 Chapters each. Please refer to your Course Calendar in Moodle for date/time of exams. Each Exam will be 30 questions and you will have 30 minutes to complete it. Exams may consist of any of the following items: multiple choice, true-false, fill-in-the-blank, matching, labeling, and abbreviations. THERE ARE NO MAKE-UPS FOR MISSED EXAMS. You must have a valid excuse that prohibits you from accessing a computer to miss an exam (personal illness, death of immediate family, or military duty) in which you notify the instructor PRIOR to the exam followed by appropriate documentation provided to instructor within 3 days from the missed exam due date. Work, personal obligations, technical problems, or "forgetting" are not appropriate excuses for missing an exam and will result in a "0" earned grade. A doctor's excuse from personal illness must specify that you are unable to complete an online exam.

All quizzes and exams are administered through Pearson's MyMedicalTerminologyLab and are <u>timed</u>. The "system" WILL automatically submit your quiz/exam if you go over the time limit. If you experience technical difficulties during a quiz or exam, you may be required to come to campus in order to complete it. If an exam or quiz is missed with a valid excuse, a make-up must be completed within 1 week of the due date, usually during faculty office hours (so make sure you clear your schedule).

If at any time you need to review a quiz or exam, please make an appointment to see your instructor. You will have up to 1 week after the due date to view any item.

**Note about Holidays:** Please be aware that this class continues to fully function during holidays. Quiz due dates may fall near a day that is considered a holiday but are still due at the assigned time (see Course Calendar). This includes SPRING/FALL BREAK, JULY 4<sup>th</sup>, AND EASTER/MARDI GRAS/THANKSGIVING WEEK! Please make provisions to complete all of your quizzes on time. A quiz will NOT be reopened once the due date has passed!

Academic Continuity Plan (School Closure due to Hurricanes/Natural Disasters/Etc): In the event of a hurricane/natural disaster or school closure, please try to stay on track with your readings & assignments. However, I will implement extended dates for completing your weekly quizzes or exams should they fall on these dates.

Students may not report to clinical until the issue is resolved. Failure to report any and all subsequent disciplinary actions, arrests, or impairments may result in automatic dismissal from the School of Nursing, will ultimately result in denial of licensure as a registered nurse, and will constitute falsification of records.
